



In Celebration of the 40th anniversary of the Red Lake River's Designation as an official Canoe route, the Red Lake River Corridor Enhancement group in cooperation with the cities located within the Red Lake River Watershed District, will be sponsoring a canoe trip covering the length of the Red Lake River. Beginning at Red Lake on the Red Lake Nation Reservation, the trip will continue down the length of the river concluding in East Grand Forks. The trip will include stops in the communities of Thief River Falls, St. Hillarie, Red Lake Falls, Gentilly, Crookston and Fisher.

About the Red Lake River:

The Red Lake River is a tributary of the Red River of the North in Northwest Minnesota. The Red Lake River covers a wide variety of terrain. After leaving the Red Lake, the river flows through a marsh in the Red Lake Indian Reservation. The river then flows through a prairie landscape area before entering farmland. After St. Hillarie the sides of the river grow steeper, becoming large eroding cliffs. Parts of the river are thickly forested.
